A 22-year-old female presented in dental OPD with complain of painful swelling in the right maxillary canine region for last two months. Orthopantomogram shows a pear-shaped well-defined radiolucent area causing bone resorption, between the diverging roots of right maxillary central incisor and first premolar tooth with no evidence of

root resorption. Histopathology of the lesion revealed a benign encapsulated mass composed of whorls, sheets and strands of epithelial cells, and microcysts with an eosinophilic material. Foci of amorphous material, areas of haemorrhage, dilated and congested blood vessels were also noted.




Fig. 2. Histopathological findings.
